In the Garden 2022 No. 5

Propagation means growing a cutting from a plant. It is rewarding to watch a small cutting become a full grown bush just like the parent plant. There are several ways to do this. The first is selecting a cutting or several from last year's growth approximately 20 centimetres long (8 inches). Place your cutting in a jar of water in a warm, but not hot position until it shoots roots in approximately 6 to 8 weeks. Then place into a pot with soil or potting mix.

Another way is to purchase potting or cutting sand and follow the directions, or just plant your cutting directly into soil or potting mix and keep moist. Each method has its own merits.

Planting now into the veggie patch: Broad Beans, Celery, Celeriac, Peas and Parsley. Planting flowers: Asters, Calendula, Chrysanthemum, Cabbage and Kale. While not actually flowers, ornamental Cabbages and Kale have been bred to add a lovely pop of colour to your garden.



A Shark Blown up with Dynamite

(The Areas' Express Jan 29th, 1915)

Port Wakefield Jan. 26.

On Sunday last, the friends of Mr E. J. Winter were considerably anxious as to his whereabouts when darkness set in, he having left in an open boat at an early hour to visit friends on the other side of the gulf.

About 10 p.m Mr Tromene put off in his quick sailing boat in search, and after flashing the search tights for some time discovered the missing man in an almost exhausted condition about a mile from the wharf. It appears that having secured a supply of fresh meat at Clinton, he had been closely followed by two sharks which kept heading him off his course and there being no wind he had to rely on the oars, and driven to desperation, fixed a plug of dynamite in the half of a sheep and heaved it overboard and about sunset had the satisfaction of seeing one of the monsters blown to pieces, the other then gave up the chase.

Birds of the Port Wakefield Area

Singing Honeyeater

Gavicalis virescens



Probably the most common honeyeater in the Port Wakefield Area. The bird lives in a wide range of shrub-land, wood-land and coastal habitat. It is relatively common and widespread right across Australia west of the Great Dividing Range, through to the west coast and on Western Australian coastal islands.

Singing honeyeaters can vary in length from 17–22 cm. Their over-all appearance is grey-brown. The tail and wings are olive-green with flashes of yellow. There is a broad black stripe running from the behind the beak to the back, and a yellow streak immediately below this from the eye. The bird's song ranges from scratchy to melodious. The song also varies according to where they live.




