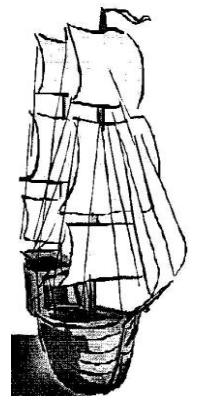

Port Wakefield Overpass and Highway Duplication – Nightworks and Changed Traffic Arrangements – Port Wakefield Highway and Balaklava Road.

To safely facilitate asphalt maintenance works in the Port Wakefield township, southbound and northbound carriageways of Port Wakefield Highway will be temporarily closed between Liberty Service Station and Ketch Road each night from **Sunday 2 June to Monday 24 June 2024**, weather permitting. Working hours are 6pm to 7am each night. No works will occur on Monday 10 June.

Additionally, **Balaklava Road will be closed at the intersection of Port Wakefield Highway.** Traffic will be detoured via Shrike Road and Kallora Road, south of Port Wakefield (see map on our website <https://pw2pa.com.au/wp-content/uploads/2024/05/Asphalting-Night-Work-Port-Wakefield-Highway-June2024.pdf>).

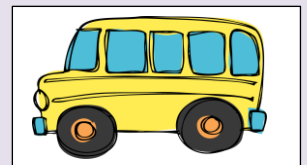

Funding boost secures initial stages of Port Wakefield's rejuvenation

Further improvements to Port Wakefield's Edward Street and tidal pool precinct have now been secured on the back of a \$1 million State Government grant.

This injection of funding towards the Celebrating Port Wakefield's Cultural Connection project, which has already been supported with \$619K from the Federal Government's Local Road and Infrastructure Program and \$500K from the State Government's Open Spaces & Places for People program, will see Edward Street transformed over the coming year. Alongside Council's contribution of \$200K for the tidal pool dredging and \$500K for upgrades to Edward Street, this recent funding will bring the project total up to \$2.81 million.

Mayor Rodney Reid said this project has been a long time coming and paired with the dual carriageway through Port Wakefield, the time to activate Edward Street was now.

"We've known that Port Wakefield has needed an upgrade for a long-time, but we were cautious of what might happen with the highway upgrade," he said. "Now that project is completed, we can reinvigorate Port Wakefield and draw people into this great town."

"Council has done an enormous amount of consultation with the community to ensure this project delivers the community's vision all the way from the highway along Edward Street to the foreshore precinct. Through our masterplan, we've worked towards something that will work for both residents and tourists, with the end goal to make Port Wakefield a tourist destination, more than just a thoroughfare."

Works to the precinct will include a new town centre plaza on Edward Street, tree planting, footpath and pram ramp upgrades, the establishment of an Indigenous art trail that will lead to the foreshore precinct where the failing tidal pool boardwalk will be replaced with a new compliant bridge that will allow kayakers under it and provide better access to the water for swimmers. Capping it all off is the long-awaited dredging of the tidal pool.

"This funding will give the project the boost it needs to deliver our vision for the area, it's going to be very exciting times ahead in Port Wakefield," Mayor Reid said. "We're incredibly thankful for the State Government support towards this project."

The Central Advocate June 28th, 1907



PORT WAKEFIELD--Cold, frosty weather is the order of things at present, each morning presents a sheet of ice over the ground.

On Friday evening last J. W. Carr, who had been making himself unpopular about the town, was given a few hours to make himself scarce, but turned up again all smiles on Saturday, and was rewarded by being locked up, and later in the day received one month's hard in Wallaroo from Mr E.M. Hewett.

Yesterday, in broad daylight, a couple of bike riders collided with each other in one of the streets, completely turning both machines and riders upside down.

For weeks past extensive preparations have been in hand for an invasion of Balaklava by our boy's football club. Heavy outlays have been gone into to bring them up to date in appearance, and every spare moment has been devoted to practice, so that it won't be their fault if they do not secure a win on the field of battle to-day. Most of their parents are anxious for this much-talked of match to be over, as most of the lads have a large amount of homework to attend to, which has sadly got into arrears during active operations with the football.

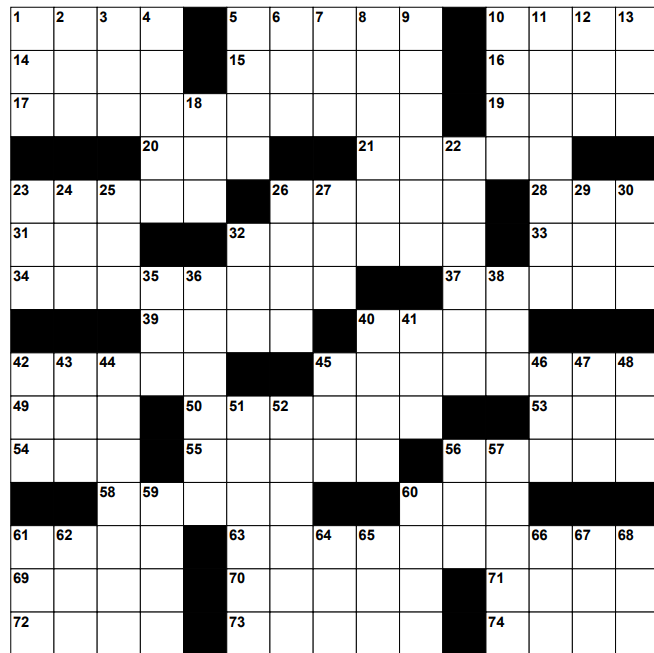
