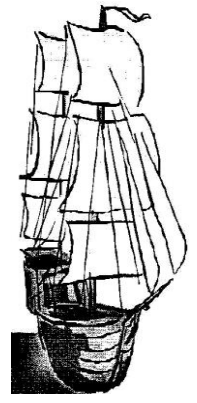

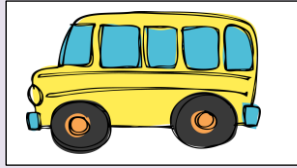

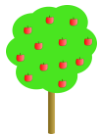

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Yesterday's News

The Chronicle August 6, 1904



PORT WAKEFIELD. July 26.— Splendid showers of rain, followed by sunshine, have placed the season far in advance of former years. The wheat crops are looking magnificent, while there is an abundance of feed. Patches of soil which have never been known before to do anything but grow saltbush have now turned to grass growing. Sheep and cattle are in splendid condition. Mice are fast leaving for warmer parts, while rabbits are increasing, and growing fat on the young wheat. New buildings are being created in various parts of the town. Vacant allotments in the sandhills have been purchased, fenced in, and earthworks thrown up around them. They are to be turned into orchards.

July 23. — Some excitement was caused last night by the behaviour of a powerful man, M.F. Conlin, which led to his being arrested by Mounted - Constable Jones, assisted by Special - Constable Baker. When being arrested he fought desperately, but was overpowered and, with the assistance of Messrs. Donnellan, Orr, and Snadden, the police were enabled to take him some distance to the cell. He appeared this morning before Messrs. Hubble and Drake, and for riotous behaviour in Florence-street was ordered 14 days in the Wallaroo Gaol; for resisting the police two months; and for damaging the cell bucket had to pay a fine of 5/. The justices awarded the two and a half months without the option of a fine, and intimated their intention of dealing severely with such offenders. On account of the large number of men continually about the town, through the extra work now in progress, and the nearer approach of the pipe-track, it will be more than one officer's work to maintain peace and order.
