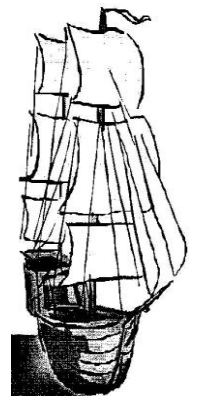

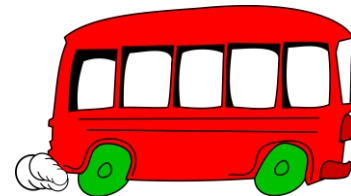

Now's the time to start making sure you're taking advantage of your recycling and organics bin, to curb waste from your red bin.

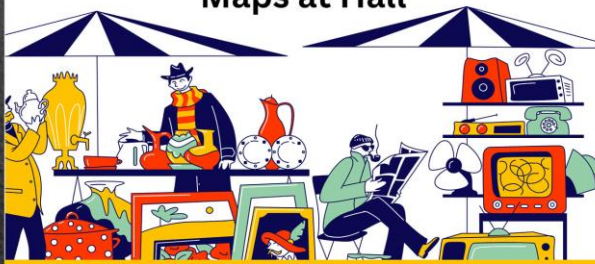

Yesterday's News

The Wooroora Producer October 3rd, 1918



An Alpine Goat and Bees at Port Wakefield.

Some little time back a gentleman transferred himself and effects from a far northern town to this place, and amongst his effects were an Alpine goat and three swarms of bees, which evoked considerable admiration among his newly acquired neighbours. The goat, which is a beautiful animal as far as goats go, is an expert climber. It can spring upward to a considerable height, and although attached to a long chain, has caused considerable excitement amongst the juvenile fraternity in their attempts to capture the animal when loose. Last week a well-known vegetarian found the animal sampling some young- French beans. On being attacked it scaled six feet of wire netting, and when hotly pursued leaped into the branches of a pepper tree, from which the owner dislodged it with the assistance of a fire hose.

The bees are, however, stirring up and exciting things much more. A dairy proprietor has a refractory cow, which has a habit of milking herself. To prevent this, two kerosene tins are fastened around the animal's neck. Yesterday evening she was lying under a bush where a swarm of bees had bunched themselves, and thinking the holes in the tins were hives, entered by the dozens and would probably have all got in had not a foolhardy bee stung the dozing animal on the nose. The excited beast cleared the fence and went through East Terrace at a great pace, followed by millions of bees. The noise of those in the tins, mingling with the bellowing of the cow, led many persons to surmise that a Zeppelin had invaded this usually quiet part of the State.

After leaving the tins the busy bees settled in a saltbush, where they were located by the owner and a bee expert, who proposed to show an admiring crowd how to catch them by the handful unprotected and without receiving a sling. The first handful he took was the last, and he is now enjoying a week's leave from work. This swarm later on took up their abode under a kitchen, effecting an entrance through an air brick. They kept that house lively for a time, and the owner, in his efforts to capture them, used more and some more language. Another swarm left and hung themselves on a bush in one of the thoroughfares. Two youths found them, and with youthful tact obtained a mouse-eaten corn sack and enveloped them in that. Breaking off the limb the bees were on, the lads spent a week from school endeavoring to regain their eyesight, and their faces now bear the appearance of hot cross buns.

One of our favourite sons, Justin played all his grass-roots footy at our club, before going on to have a hugely successful SANFL career, at Woodville West Torrens FC, spanning 15 years.

His long list of accolades and credentials at WWT Eagles includes:

- WWT game record holder (266 games) & 181 goals, which earned him SANFL player life membership
- 3 x club champion 2002, 2003 & 2010 - 2 x premiership player - Captain 2007
- Acting premiership captain 2006 - Five top 3 finishes in Magarey Medal
- Life Member - Life Governor (Hall of Fame) 2020

He was drafted to Adelaide Crows, where he played his debut AFL game against Geelong in 2000. He played five games until a broken foot sidelined him for 14 weeks and he returned to the Eagles. After an incredible state-level career, he retired from SANFL in 2012.

A local fisherman and a country boy at heart, footy has always been in Ciccys blood.

By his own admission, school was never his thing ... he was much more at home on the footy oval & could always be seen with a footy in his hands!

His dad Mick and younger brother Dylan are both club legends, having played more than 800 games between them, while mum Pat is number one supporter of all her boys!

We've enjoyed seeing Justin and partner Kellie around the club over the past few years, with daughter Asha playing minis last year, stepson Jake Lee playing in our A grade and dad Mick coaching our senior colts.

We can't wait to have Justin's knowledge, energy and passion back in the club, to build on the foundations set by current coach Jared Wilson, and are super excited for season 2025.

We also extend a huge thank you to outgoing head coach Jared Wilson for his enormous contribution over the last four seasons. Jaz has poured his heart and soul into our senior playing group, and we are very grateful for his time and dedication. 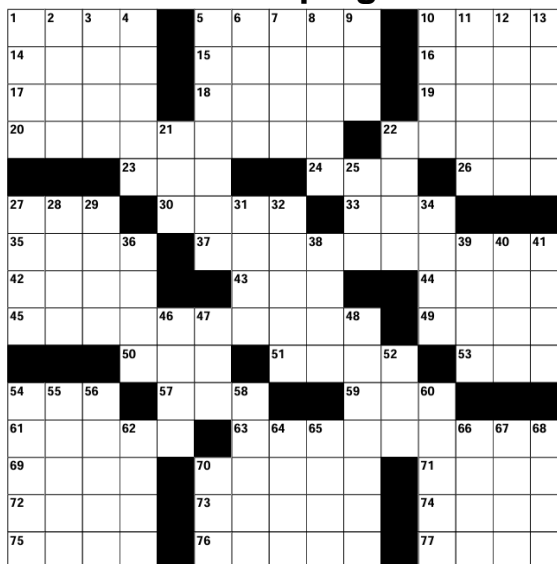
