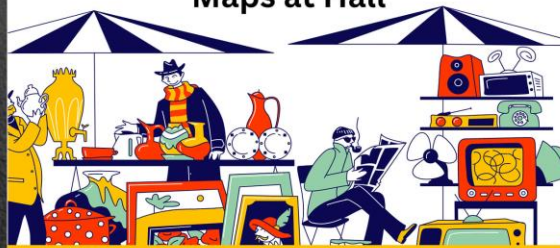

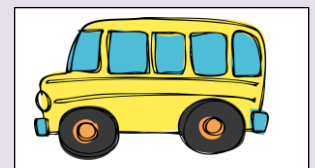

**Have your say on Council's Draft
Infrastructure Asset Management Plan for
Transport**

COUNCIL is now seeking community feedback on our Infrastructure Asset Management Plan for Transport. The purpose of the Infrastructure Asset Management Plan (IAMP) for Transport is to provide a clear strategy for the maintenance, renewal and upgrade of Council's road network. Council's road network comprises 144km of sealed rural roads, 76km of sealed township roads, 1548km of unsealed sheeted roads and 946km of formed and unformed graded roads, making it one of the largest council owned road networks in the state

The draft plan is a review of the current IAMP for Transport, with progress updates and financial data based on the 1 July 2022 revaluation, updated with capital works costs from 2022-23 and maintenance costs experienced in the 2023-24 financial year. This draft highlights the progress made on all eight key strategies that formed the priorities and the direction taken in the current plan. It also identifies known deficiencies, while forecasting future demand and expenditure requirements. A major objective of this plan is to continue to reduce the road backlog through the ongoing funding of sealed and unsealed road renewal. There are also plans to address risk and improve access for heavy vehicles through intersection upgrades and upgrading unsealed roads to sealed in support of poultry farms, hay and grain delivery and housing developments.

The Central Advocate October 11th, 1907



PORT WAKEFIELD -- The influenza epidemic has somewhat subsided, but it will take some time to efface the disaster wrought by it. In spite of the depression hanging over the town Captain A. O'Brien last Saturday selected a team of railway cricketers and waged war against an eleven from the town, most of them having just left their beds from illness, and being in a state more fit for the hospital, they had to defend themselves against the onslaught of their opponents, and although they battled as well as they could, they had to give in to those who had not been laid up. The Captain of the Railways on being remonstrated with explained that since being in office he had suffered nothing but defeats and had to secure a win no matter at what price.

During the absence of M.C. Jones on Monday night last a gentleman with a cargo of pinky on board made a most infernal disturbance through the streets until a very late hour. His musical voice was heard in advance of the rush and the roar of numerous special trains. He was requested to desist and sign the pledge by special Constables Baker and Strawhan, and on refusing to do so was overpowered and placed in the cells. What his fate will yet be is at present undecided.

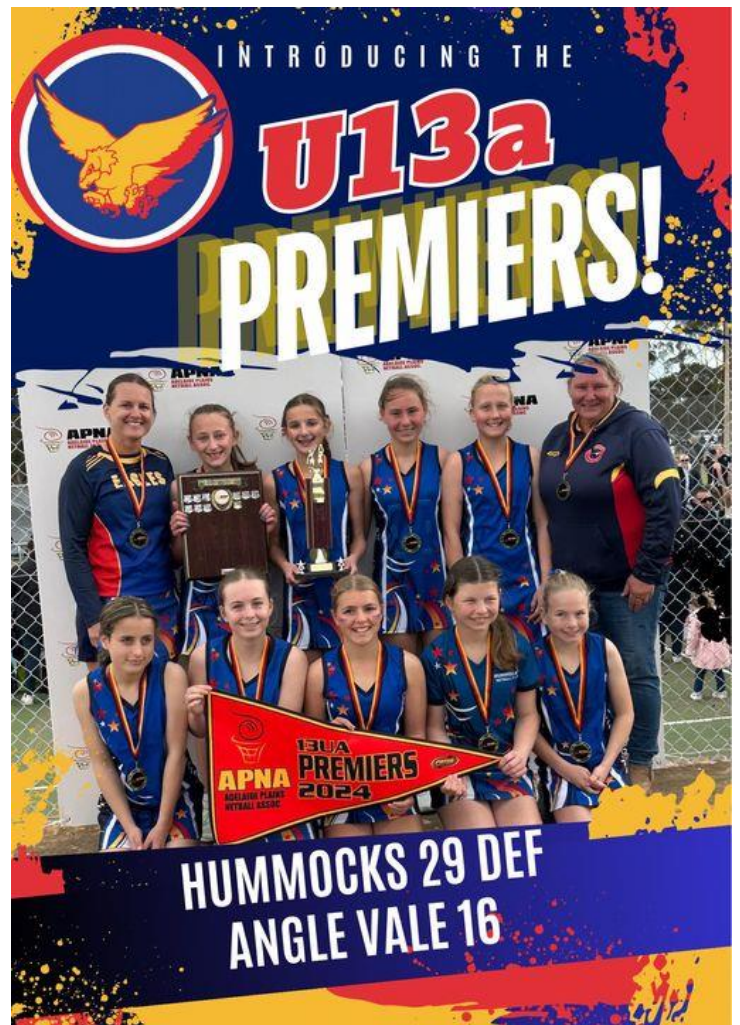

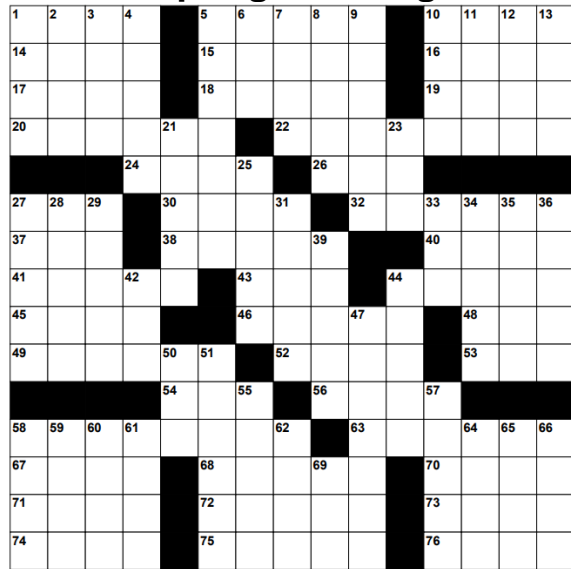
