



Yesterday's News

South Australian Register November 7th, 1888



PORT WAKEFIELD — We have had terrible weather of late, the glass being 100' in the shade at times. It is cooler now. We have had a few drops of rain, but only a few drops, and it is wonderful that there is yet a promise of some wheat but, of course, it will be very light. Hay harvest is well nigh over, with very small yield. We have more wool passing here than on any former season for a number of years past, partly owing to the liberal terms of the Shipping Company for freight.

One or two accidents have occurred lately. One man, under the influence of drink, fell out of his spring-cart twice one afternoon, and the second time was seriously hurt. Under the care of Dr. Rogers he is progressing favourably, though not yet out of danger. Amusements have been thick upon us lately. What with entertainments, circus, and swingboats our people must be pretty much eased of small change. The Chronicle November 18th, 1905

A wandering sailor recently met with a painful experience whilst in search of a place to camp in on the wharf about 8 o'clock at night. After a thorough search he selected the railway stable as a comfortable place for shelter. Noticing a small opening in the side of the structure, used chiefly to let in the air, he decided to enter by this way rather than climb over the door. Having introduced his swag he was preparing to follow when the railway horse, who had never seen anything larger than a rat enter from that direction, seized the unfortunate man by the hand with such force that when he had rescued his bundle he had to seek the assistance of Dr. Gribble, who bound up the damaged hand, which showed some ugly teeth marks. trove.nla.gov.au/newspaper/article/88149386


